ABERDEENSHIRE COUNCIL ARTS IN THE COMMUNITY GRANTS SCHEME

2009/2010 Guidelines and Applications Form

As part of its service to the arts, Kincardine & Deeside Arts Forum operates a Community Arts Grants scheme on behalf of Aberdeenshire Council, and in conjunction with the other arts forums of Aberdeenshire.

Residents and groups based in south Aberdeenshire* may apply for advance funding for a range of arts activities and events, for equipment purchases, tuition expenses, and other purposes explained on the next pages.

Please note that grants cannot be issued retrospectively - after an event or use of funds.

Priority will be given to applications that support the aims of the Aberdeenshire Arts Strategy. (information enclosed)

Grant requests will not be considered from individuals who are under 12 years old. Young applicants, schools and groups of pupils may find a useful funding source in one of the Education Trusts administered by Aberdeenshire Council Education; for more information please ring Amanda Watson on 01261 813335.

CATEGORIES OF ASSISTANCE

Personal Development Grant

This stepping-stone grant enables recipients to expand their repertoire of skills and broaden their experience. The award is a commitment to lifelong learning, with particular attention given to bridging the gap between school and a career in the arts, or the furtherance of an artists' professional practice.

Examples

- Material expenses for an artist working in a new medium
- Course fees for an artist/ tutor who wishes to extend skills
- Tuition fees for Youth Theatre Summer School

Eligibility - Applicant must:

- be resident in South Aberdeenshire
- demonstrate significant commitment to their practice

Grant Available

- Up to £500, to cover up to 50% of costs; in exceptional circumstances the award may cover up to 100% of costs
- Made prior to expenditure; final project and financial reports must be submitted within 6 months to confirm expenses

Project Support Grant

This award helps groups to undertake challenging new work, especially that which encourages art made by and for the local community, involves multimedia collaborations, or forges new partnerships between local organisations and regional/national practitioners.

Examples

- Theatre company staging work by a local playwright
- National performing arts company collaborating with a local group
- Artist's residency within a local community

Eligibility - Organisation must be:

- properly constituted
- based in South Aberdeenshire

Grant Available

- Up to £1000, to cover up to 50% of costs; in exceptional circumstances the award may cover up to 100% of costs.
- Made prior to expenditure; final project and financial reports must be submitted within 6 months to confirm original estimates. If the project is substantially under budget a portion of the grant will have to be repaid.
- Only one Project Support Grant will be made to a group per fiscal year (April 1-March 31),
- The group will not then be eligible to apply for a Programme Support Grant.

Programme Support Grant - Guarantee Against Loss

Guarantees against loss are available to underwrite a wide range of arts events that may involve an element of financial risk when calculating expected income against expenditure. A guarantee against loss provides security by underwriting a reasonable short-fall.

This award aides the work of local arts promoters, particularly voluntary organisations. Support is offered for one-off and annual events, as well as for the promotion of a series of events. It is expected that these grants will support new and ambitious programming.

Examples

- Local folk festival
- Year-round peripatetic music programme
- Annual art exhibition

Eligibility - Organisation must be:

- properly constituted
- based in South Aberdeenshire

Grant

- Up to £1000, to cover up to 50% of costs; in exceptional circumstances award may cover 100%
- Granted as a deficit guarantee. Final project and financial reports must be submitted within 6 months to confirm original estimates (bank interest on a loan may be included in expenditure). If the project is substantially under budget a portion of the grant will have to be repaid.
- Only one Programme Support Grant will be made to a group per financial year (April 1-March 31), and the group will not then be eligible to apply for a Project Support Grant.

Foundation Grant

This support is offered to emerging arts organisations to assist with their formation and first activities. Costs covered include routine administration expenses, such as telephone, postage, photocopying, etc., but not personnel costs nor honorariums.

Eligibility - Organisation must be:

- properly constituted
- based in South Aberdeenshire

Grant

- up to £500
- Awarded immediately; final project and financial reports must be submitted to confirm costs

GRANT CONDITIONS

If your application is successful, you will be required to:

- 1) Use the award in the manner proposed in the application.
- 2) Give credit in advertisements, press articles, and programmes to Kincardine & Deeside Arts Forum and Aberdeenshire Council for financial assistance. Please note that likewise, Kincardine & Deeside Arts Forum may publicise general details of the grant.
- 3) Submit final project and financial reports within 6 months of the event using the enclosed forms. (these can be made available electronically) Supply of press coverage or evidence of public support also is appreciated.

Failure to observe the above conditions may result in the revocation of a portion or the whole of the grant.

Please note that all Applicants to this scheme are automatically granted 3-year membership in KDAF (other forums), which will entitle them to attend the Annual General Meeting, serve on the Management Committee, receive the KDAF newsletter, and receive other benefits. How to Apply

- 1) Complete the Grant Application overleaf.
- 2) Enclose relevant supporting information, such as copies of course acceptance letters, estimates/invoices, CV, personal statement, project outline, examples of work via photos, audio/video tapes, CDs etc.
- 3) If applicant is an organisation, prepare copies of current year accounts and the group's constitution.
- 4) Send the above items at least 2 months in advance of the event or funding date to: The Secretary, Kincardine & Deeside Arts Forum, c/o Viewmount, Arduthie Road, Stonehaven, AB39 2DQ
Decisions are made by a committee approximately every two months.
